

Sydney Superyacht Guide



Sydney Harbour is commonly referred to as the most beautiful natural harbour in the world. Those who come to see it will understand why. The 240 kilometres of shoreline encompass approximately 54 square kilometres of water, which translates to an enormous area for exploration and discovery.

On a warm sunny day, the harbour is a vibrant blue and dotted with hundreds of sailing boats, motor boats and ferries. Australian's love boating!

The hub of Sydney Harbour is Circular Quay, a ferry terminus situated next to the central business district. From here its an easy walk to The Rocks, Harbour Bridge and the Sydney Opera House. All of these are iconic places recognisable worldwide and all play a great part in the history of Sydney.

Taronga Zoo, Darling Harbour, Bondi Beach. Manly Beach, Darling Harbour are all other great features of Sydney Harbour worth visiting.



Although we tend to associate the Harbour with the city of Sydney and its urban spread there are significant areas of bushland surrounding it which is protected in Sydney Harbour National Park and reserves. Many of these offer extensive bushwalks where one can see the natural flora and, if you're lucky, some of the local fauna such as the Long-nosed Bandicoot and Little Penguin. You also have many small secluded bays, small beaches and meandering rivers to explore.

Discover a different perspective on Sydney Harbour. Masteka 2 provides a new way to explore this beautiful waterway. Walk through pristine bushland at North Head Sanctuary, view stunning vistas of the city and harbour. Absorb the remarkable convict and maritime history of Sydney's largest island, the gritty and historical Cockatoo Island. Swim and relax on one of the many harbour beaches or scuba dive the waters of Chowder Bay, rich in marine plants and creatures.

Pittwater

On 2 March 1788 Captain Arthur Phillip, first governor of NSW, explored the southern arm of Broken Bay. He described this waterway as "the finest piece of water I ever saw" and named it 'Pitt Water' in honour of William Pitt, who was Prime Minister of England.

Pittwater, situated at the northern end of Sydney's Northern Beaches and just a couple of hours north of Sydney Harbour. The area's 125sq km landform is unique, featuring a diverse range of terrain, due to its land mass being located entirely on a peninsula. Pittwater comprises nine beaches with seven ocean rockpools, rugged headlands and sandstone sea cliffs, tranquil waterways and native bushland including two National Parks, with pockets of rainforest. There are also extensive wetlands providing sanctuary to many bird species, and rock platforms providing habitat for a wide range of marine life.

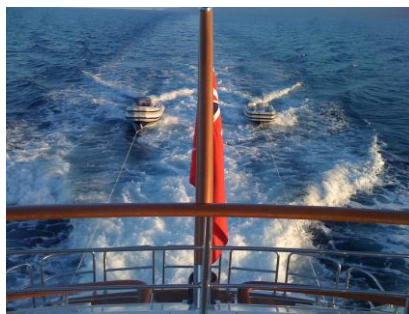

Weather in Sydney

Sydney has a temperate maritime climate; summers are hot while winters are mild and rarely, if ever, see cold temperatures.

Sydney's climate is largely dictated by its coastal position and the temperate seas that surround it. This means temperatures never get really cold as they can in other parts of the country. Also, the scorching temperatures for which the inland deserts are famous remain absent in Sydney due to the cooling sea breezes.

Best time to visit Sydney is in the Summer Months and between **September – April**.
